The Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for Corpus Christi will be held in the Cathedral on Sunday, June 18 after the 11:00 AM Mass to 5:00 PM (except during the Spanish Mass from 3:00 PM to 4:15 PM). A Eucharistic procession will be held after the 11:00 AM Mass.

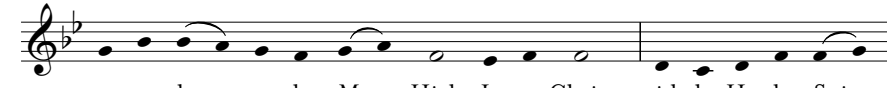

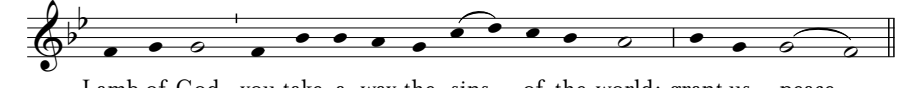
